# Code of Conduct

Page 1 of 3

The objectives of the Cerritos Girls Softball Association are to instill in the youth of the community ideals of good sportsmanship, honesty, loyalty and courage, so they might grow to be good healthy adults. This objective will be reached by providing supervised competitive athletic games. The supervisors shall bear in mind at all times, the attainment of exceptional skill or the winning of the game is secondary and the molding of future citizens is our primary concern. All rostered team personnel must sign that they will abide by the League Code of Conduct when completing their application.

## **Board Members and Meetings**

- A. All Board meetings will be conducted in a civil and courteous manner.
- B. A decision having been reached by a majority of the Board will be adhered to and actively supported by all its members.
- C. No Board Member shall use his or her position to sway any decision made by an Umpire.
- D. Unless participating as a Coach or Manager, a Board Member's only responsibility (other than of an interested spectator) while attending and League game is to inform the Umpire of any rule(s) of safety that is violated and in a situation not affecting the actual play (i.e., an unruly spectator that cannot be controlled by the Umpire or Managers).
- E. Violation of any of the above will be grounds for dismissal from the office by the majority vote of the remaining Board Members. Dismissal will follow the same procedure outlined for the dismissal of managers and coaches.

## **Managers and Coaches**

- A. All managers and coaches are expected to be courteous and civil and to always display the best example of good sportsmanship while on the field.
- B. Foul, abusive and disruptive language or any other disruptive actions directed toward a player, umpire, spectator or another coach or manager will not be tolerated. If after one warning from the umpire, the disruptive coach or manager continues with his/her behavior, the umpire shall suspend play and eject the disruptive coach or manager from the grounds (not just the playing field). If the disruptive coach or manager does not leave the grounds immediately after being ordered to do so, his/her team will forfeit the game regardless of what inning or the score. Foul, abusive and disruptive language or any other action disruptive to the progress of the game is based strictly on the opinion of the umpire.
- C. If after it has been explained and an umpire's decision continues to be challenged by a coach or manager, the umpire will eject him/her from the game
- D. A coach or manager's ejection is subject to review by the Board of Directors. Depending upon the severity of the offense, the coach or manager may be suspended or dismissed from the League.

## **Umpires**

- A. Calls made by the Umpire are official and final.
- B. A judgment call may not be disputed: only a rule interpretation.
- C. Any unruly behavior on the part of parents, coaches, managers or spectator(s) directed at the umpire or opposing team will not be tolerated. The umpire may issue a warning to the guilty party and ejection from the grounds may result.
- D. Should circumstances necessitate, umpires may suspend play. The Board of Directors will determine if the suspended game will be completed at a later date, or if a forfeiture shall be declared.

- E. A committee comprised of the Umpire-in-Chief and four (4) other Board members shall be formed to settle all disputes regarding the use or non use of Umpires in the Cerritos Girls Softball League or in a particular division of the League.

## **Players**

- A. All players are expected to be courteous, civil and exhibit good sportsmanship at all times.
- B. A player who argues, uses abusive language or intentionally throws equipment may be ejected from the game (not the field) at the discretion of the umpire.

## **Spectators**

- A. Spectators are welcomed to watch any and all games. Foul, abusive and disruptive language or any other disruptive actions directed toward any player, umpire, coach, manager or other spectator(s) will not be tolerated and could result in removal from the grounds.
- B. All spectators, players, coaches and managers are responsible for cleaning the area of all trash after each game.
- C. All persons attending Cerritos Girls Softball League events must abide by all Civil and California Educational Codes. No intoxicating or controlled substance will be allowed at any games or practices. All League officials will be responsible for monitoring this rule.
- D. The manager will be responsible for the conduct of spectators supporting his/her team.

## **Disciplinary Procedure**

The manager is responsible for the behavior of the individual members of his/her team. At the discretion of the manager, the following disciplinary measures may be taken to insure the objectives of the Cerritos Girls Softball League.

## **Benching a Player**

- A. A player may be held out for a period of one game (benched) for any of the following reasons:
  - 1. Missing two (2) consecutive practice sessions within a week without notifying and being excused by the manager.
  - 2. Missing one (1) regular season game without notifying and being excused by the manager.
  - 3. Consistently refusing to follow directions (i.e., continual tardiness for practices or games, poor sportsmanship, failure to be properly uniformed, etc.) or be in violation of the Code of Conduct for players as outlined above.
- B. The umpire, official scorekeeper, opposing manager, player and her parent/guardian are to be notified prior to the start of the game. Said player must appear in uniform throughout the game and be rostered as "benched".
- C. Prior to a player being benched, the League President, or Vice President and/or the Player Agent, along with the Division Commissioner must be notified by phone or in person the day before the game of the reason for benching the player.
- D. The Division Commissioner, (or the President, Vice President or Player Agent when the Division Commissioner is not available) will notify the parent/guardian of the benching.
- E. If there is a disagreement by the parent or a Board Member, the benching shall be reviewed prior to game time.
- F. Any manager wanting to bench a player more than once must have prior approval of the President, Vice President, Player Agent or Division Commissioner

## **Dropping a Player**

- A. A player securing three (3) unexcused absences or otherwise conducts herself in a manner judged by the manager to be detrimental to the overall good of the team may be dropped. The following procedure must be adhered to in dropping a player.
  1. Warn the player and note the date and time of the warning.
  2. The manager will notify the player's parent/guardian and enlist their help in correcting the problem. Note date and time of contact with parent/guardian.
  3. Notify division Commissioner.
  4. Division Commissioner will notify player's parent/guardian for the purpose of setting up a meeting to notify them that the player may be dropped if there is not immediate improvement.
  5. Division Commissioner shall monitor player and if improvement is not immediately forthcoming, will then notify President, Vice President, Player Agent and parent/guardian that player is going to be dropped.
  6. After notifying the player that she has been dropped, the Division Commissioner then notifies the team manager and sends a written report of the overall situation to the Player Agent to be attached to the player's application.
- B. A dropped player is not entitled to any refund.

## Team Structure

The managers and coaches may be male or female, however, without exception, there must be an *adult female* in charge of the dugout during all games and present at all team meetings and practices.

The manager is the person in charge of the team and all of the team responsibilities. It is important that the team manager solicit input from the coaches, chaperone, and team Mom concerning the operation of the team. It is also important that the coaches, chaperone and team Mom assist the team manager by accepting graciously some of the duties that the manager may want to delegate.

Remember the key word here is *team* and everybody should be working together as a team to accomplish the best for the players and the League. The team staff needs to be a very cohesive group.

The following pages are recommendations for the division of duties of the manager, coach, chaperone, and team Mom. Remember these are suggestions and have worked in the past, but the goal should be to provide a safe learning environment in which all members of a team have fun.

## **A. Manager**

1. Chooses the coaching staff
2. Chooses a chaperone and team Mom ( may be same person)
3. Attends and assist with player assessments
4. Attends the draft
5. Selects colors for team uniform with assistance from team
6. Attends and participates in pre season clinics
7. Sets the day, time and place for practice
8. Attends all practices and games
9. Checks out equipment and is responsible for League equipment
10. Attends all scheduled manager's meetings and periodic board meetings
11. Prepares the roster and lineup for all games
12. Should be knowledgeable of all playing rules
13. Sets good example of sportsmanship
14. Makes the season fun and enjoyable for all
15. Insures compliance with League bylaws, rules and policies

### **Roles of Sportsmanship**

1. Treats his/her players, and opponents with respect
2. Inspires in the athletes a love for the game and the desire to compete fairly
3. Is the type of person he/she wants the athletes to be.
4. Disciplines those on the team who do **not** display good sportsmanship.
5. Respects the judgment and interpretation of the rules by the officials.
6. Knows he/she is a teacher, and understands the athletic arena is a classroom

## **B. Coaches**

1. Teach the fundamentals of girls softball
2. Teach and stress sportsmanship
3. Assist the manager in decision making
4. Display proper conduct on and off the field
5. Be punctual for all team practices and games
6. Be supportive of all the girls in the League

### **Roles of Sportsmanship**

1. Treats his/her players and opponents with respect.
2. Inspires in the athletes a love for the game and the desire to compete fairly.
3. Is the type of person he/she wants the athletes to be.
4. Disciplines those on the team who do **not** display good sportsmanship.
5. Respects the judgment and interpretation of the rules by the officials.
6. Knows he/she is a teacher and understands the athletic arena is a classroom.

## **C. Chaperone/Team Mom**

1. Maintain the team spirit
2. Maintain order in the dugout
3. Assist with the team batting order
4. Assist manager and coaches at practices and games

5. Check the girls for proper uniform
6. Maintain the first aid kit
7. Maintain a good line of communications between the girls and the manager and coaches
8. Be supportive of the staff and girls
9. Helps get uniforms in order
10. Prepares the team banner with the assistance of the girls
11. Prepares the snack and drink schedule
12. Takes charge of fund-raisers and pictures
13. Arranges parties with staff
14. Helps with transportation
15. Collects monies for gifts for coaching staff
16. Coordinates team parties, etc.

## **D. Parents**

1. Attend the MANDATORY team meeting with daughter's manager at beginning of season.
2. Get daughter signed up, pay fees, and provide League with copy of birth certificate if required
3. Provide transportation or make arrangements for practices, games, team meetings, parties and picnic
4. Keep uniform neat and clean
5. Provide after game snacks when scheduled
6. Support League fund-raisers
7. Provide proper equipment for daughter (Check with manager and coaches for assistance)
8. Alert the manager of any problems with daughter
9. Attend games and support the girls (your presence, support, and enthusiasm is essential to the success and enjoyment of the program)
10. Volunteer to help (team scorekeeper, or assist team Mom if needed)
11. Display good sportsmanship at all times
12. Parents "MUST" accept responsibility to work the assigned minimum time in the snack bar. Failure to accept this responsibility will result in penalty. (*We do not like this policy either; but unfortunately, some parents have made it necessary.*)

## **Roles of Sportsmanship**

1. Attempts to understand and remain informed of the playing rules.
2. Appreciates good play no matter who makes it.
3. Shows compassion for an injured player, applauds positive performance, does not heckle, jeer or distract players; and avoids use of profane and obnoxious language and behavior.
4. Respects the judgment and strategy of the manager/coach, and does not criticize players or manager/coaches for loss of a game.
5. Respects property of others and authority of those who administer the competition.

## **E. Players**

1. Accept the draft results
2. Conduct yourself in a proper manner at all League functions. Disrespect, bad language, physical abuse or insubordination will be met with appropriate disciplinary action.

3. Abide by manager's and coach's decisions regarding game positions, batting order, practices and playing strategies. Do not argue with your manager or coach over their decisions, they run the team.
4. Participate in **all** practices and be ready to learn
5. Be on time to **all** practices and games
6. Notify manager if you are going to be absent or need to leave early.
7. During a game, players are not allowed to leave the dugout without the permission of the manager. Players are not to discuss any play, decision or personal opinion with spectators, parents or officials.
8. Players are expected to participate in all League functions and fund-raisers.
9. Players with long hair shall keep it pulled back in a ponytail or braids. Jewelry shall not be worn during a game or practices, except medical ID is only.
10. Take care of all League equipment used by your team. Treat park facilities with respect, i.e., dugouts, fences, benches, bleachers, rest rooms, snack bar, diamonds, fields, etc. Clean up the dugout when leaving after the game.
11. Display good sportsmanship on and off the field
12. Has lots of FUN !!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!

## **Roles of Sportsmanship**

1. Treats opponents with respect.
2. Exercises self-control at all times, setting the example for others to follow.
3. Respects officials and accepts their decisions without gesture or argument.
4. Wins without boasting, lose without excuses, and never quits. "Never, never, never, never, ever quits" --Winston Churchill
5. Always remember that it is a privilege to represent the League, school and community.

## **F. Specific Game Responsibilities for Team Staff**

1. Home team is responsible for lining the field, equipment and game ball. Check to see if you are the last team of the day to use the field, if you are, then you are also responsible for putting all the equipment (bases, pitching mound, chalk, etc.) away.
2. Home team is responsible for getting the official score book and furnishing the official score keeper if not provided by the League.
3. Check to see if girls are properly dressed in uniforms (improper or incomplete uniforms can cause game forfeiture.)
  - a. visor, jersey, pants stirrups, sanitary socks, cleats or athletic shoes
  - b. **In cold weather** a turtleneck, etc. can be worn under the jersey or a jacket can be worn over the team jersey.
  - c. For safety reasons and to assist the umpire in making calls, the **jersey must be tucked in** and if a jacket is worn it must be buttoned or zipped up.
  - d. Anyone who may be sliding during a game **must** be wearing a protective sliding undergarment and kneepads.
4. Keep order on the bench.
5. Keep team in dugout (no wandering around, visiting snack bar, bleachers, or friends).
6. No food or drinks (other than water provided) in the dugout.
7. Keep in lineup order and keep lineup going smoothly.
8. All batters, runners, and on-deck batter must be wearing a helmet

9. See that all equipment is returned to its proper place.
10. Assist players in *timely* field exit and entry.
11. At the end of the inning make notation on batting order board who will be lead off batter next inning.
12. Be sure first aid kit is available and stocked

# Snack Bar

The Snack Bar(s) are operated by the Cerritos Girls Softball Association for everybody's convenience and patronage. Funds received from the snack bar sales constitute a large income revenue toward the League expenses. Consequently, they are absolutely vital to the continuance and improvement of the program. It is a monumental job to run the snack bar(s) efficiently and profitably. It requires a great deal of cooperation, time and effort from the Snack Bar Manager, the League Board of Directors, managers, coaches and parents.

There have been times in the past when people have not done their duty and ultimately caused a tremendous amount of overwork for the Snack Bar Manager and the people who ended up doing extra snack bar duty over and over again. ***This is not fair !!*** This type of inconsideration eventually affects everyone...managers, coaches, the girls and the parents. If everyone would cooperate and do their assigned time, it would work out to be a small sacrifice for the benefits reaped by the League.

Eligible workers for the snack bar must be filled by adults, 18 years old or older and children under 18 years of age are not permitted in the snack bar work area. Managers will be notified by the Snack Bar Manager or Division Commissioner of the team's scheduled work hours.

**Parents not able to** (regardless of the reason and we've heard them all) **work their snack bar assignment will forfeit the fifty dollars (\$50) deposit which will be collected at the time of registration. Those who show up on their scheduled shift time and work the assigned hours will have their deposit returned. Those who fail to show up on the scheduled day and time will have their fifty dollars deposited to the League account. There will be a \$5 additional charge for any returned checks and the child's trophy will be withheld until all debts are cleared.**

Parents of all participants in any Cerritos Girls Softball League hosted tournament are required to work the snack bar.

# **Team Banners**

Each team is responsible for providing a team banner. The guidelines for the preparation and displaying of the banner are as follows:

1. Banner size shall be 5 ft. wide by 3 ft. high.
2. It shall include the name of the team, players names, manager, coach(es), team Mom/Chaperone, and sponsor's name.
3. Banners shall be ready to be judged at Opening Day Ceremonies. Winners will be announced at that time.
4. Each division winner will receive a team prize.
5. Banners that do not meet the requirements will automatically be disqualified from judging.
6. Banners shall be hung at every game on the fence close to the team's dugout.

*Only banners designed and made by the team will be eligible for judging and prizes. Professionally made banners will not be eligible for judging.*

## **Sponsors & Donations**

Each team (spring, winter & tournament) is responsible for securing their team sponsor(s). There are three levels of sponsorship. The first level being a full sponsorship for a donation of \$250.00 or more. The second level is with a donation of \$125.00 or more and the third level is with a donation of \$50.00 or more.

All sponsor donations received by the team will be deposited with and disbursed by the League treasurer. (Exception: solicitation of funds from the parents/guardians of the players for the purpose of purchasing gifts for the coaching staff, player awards and end of season party.) All sponsor/donation money received by a team will be credited to that teams account

Sponsors will receive the following for their donation:

Full of \$250.00 or more – Plaque with team picture and name on team banner

Partial of \$125.00 or more – Plaque of appreciation

Partial of \$50.00 or more – certificate of appreciation

Sponsor's fees or donations secured by League members, not directly associated with a team, will not be divided and the total amount will be credited to the League account. In the event a team or teams do not secure their own sponsor, a League sponsor's name may be assigned for the purpose of displaying on the team banner.

Additional fundraisers, such as car washes, bake sales, etc., may be held by individual teams to raise funds for the team's special account provided the fundraiser is not in conflict with any League fundraiser. Any team wanting to do any additional fundraising must submit a prior written request to the board and receive approval from the Board of Directors.

The funds in the team accounts are intended to benefit the players in an effort to learn softball. The funds can be used to educate, train, or equip the players, or for tournament entrance fees. The funds are not to be used for entertainment.

A piece of equipment purchased with team funds, or donated and used by the team, such as a batting net, pitching machine, portable generator, etc. becomes the property of the League at the conclusion of the season in which it was obtained.

Expenditure of funds and the purpose of the expenditure require prior League approval. Expenditures will be only be reimbursed when proper documentation (receipt) has been submitted to the League treasurer.

Funds remaining in the team account at the end of the season will be transferred to the League general fund account and the team account will be considered closed. The end of the season is the last scheduled game, including playoffs.

None of the funds are to be used for purchasing any item for any adult member of the team staff or parent/guardian. The funds are for the team players only. Funds are not to be used for year-end parties.
